To get there: From Hanover, take Rte. 10 north. Turn right on Reservoir Rd. Go about ½ mile and park in the parking lot for the Ray School on the left.

Overview

The Hanover Conservation Council is a private, non-profit organization incorporated in 1963. The mission of the Council is to promote the appreciation and conservation of land and natural habitat in Hanover. Their mission is achieved with programs in land conservation, environmental education and support for conservation oriented public policies. Currently, over 450 households pay dues to the Council in support of its activities. One of the Council's holdings is the Balch Hill Natural Area.

Clues

Along Reservoir Road, east you will go

To a bike path that doesn't quite show...

Unless you look for mailbox #29:

Then to the left of the driveway, your path you will find.

Follow this path to the trail on the right.

Just be careful, and enjoy all the sights.

Up the hill, follow blazes of white and blue

But be sure not to miss the arrows, too.

Continue on to almost the top

For it is there that you will need to stop.

So pause and look at the great grandfather trees—

Because your treasure is hidden in one of these.

After finding the treasure, continue on to the top.
There's a beautiful view that will cause you to stop.
Nearby, too, is an amazing oak,
17 feet around—this isn't a joke!
See Mt. Ascutney from the top; and Baker Tower, too.
And on your way down just reverse all these clues.
